**Job Summary**

Serving the Northeast Region of Ontario, the Service of Seniors' Psychiatry is seeking a Family Physician (Care of the Elderly) to join its team to provide inpatient and outreach intervention to older adults with complex age-related psychiatric and neurocognitive illnesses often complicated by medical comorbidities. Working in a dynamic, interdisciplinary team-based program, the incumbent will apply clinical leadership and expertise in the assessment, treatment, and/or consultation for in-patient and community-based seniors' care.

Our inpatient service includes a 12-bed tertiary Geriatric Psychiatry Assessment and Treatment Unit, a 21-bed District Dementia Care Unit in North Bay, and an 18-bed Regional Dementia Care Unit in the neighbouring community of Sudbury. Our community-based Regional Consultation Service provides specialized mental health services and education for older adults and their care providers. This includes comprehensive assessment, intervention, and support to assist individuals with age-related mental health disorders remain in the community and to prevent hospitalization where possible. NBRHC is also the provincial lead organization for the Behavioural Supports Ontario program.

In addition, there are opportunities to join the faculty of NOSM and engage in clinical teaching at the undergraduate and postgraduate level, or be involved in clinical research through our partnerships with the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health, and the Consortium of Canadian Centres for Clinical Cognitive Research (C5R).

**Qualifications**

Applicants are required to be certified in Family Medicine (Care of the Elderly) by the College of Family Physicians of Canada (or the equivalent in another jurisdiction) and must be licensed (or eligible for licensure) in the Province of Ontario. *A Certificate of Added Competence in Care of the Elderly is a valuable added qualification for this position. Individuals without the certificate but with an interest may be financially supported in obtaining through a return of service agreement.*

**Remuneration**

Competitive monthly clinical stipend with opportunities for additional OHIP billing income, and teaching stipends.

An attractive incentive package which includes a \$25 000 non-repayable and interest free loan, relocation funding and up to \$80,000 through the Northern Rural Recruitment & Retention Initiative (NRRRI).
